- ◆ Your new hobbies may provide a perfect place to practice!




## **CHALLENGES**

- ♦ Don't be afraid to ask.
- Come up with a clear proposal.





- Build confidence via simple, fun activities.
- Infuse pop culture references connect with students and co-workers on their level.

#### **SOLUTIONS**

- Find someone to help you translate (ALTs, CIRs,
   PAs and JTEs are great resources).
- Don't be afraid to use broken Japanese.
- Ask around about existing projects/find out what your prefecture has done in the past.
- Have an idea of your own? Great! Tell everyone and gauge interest!
- Organize yourself and your time, submit a clear proposal, and write reports after the event.
- Use weekends, national holidays and school vacations to create unforgettable memories.
- ♦ GET SUPPORT! AJET is there to help you!



## Opening doors...

- Be proactive; prepare a clear proposal; your persistence, perseverance & patience will pay off.
- Don't let your Japanese skills become a barrier to your involvement it doesn't matter!
- ◆ Remember: JET is what you make of it so get out there, challenge yourself, try new things, and take advantage of this once-in-a-lifetime experience. Having the right attitude can change everything.
